On the third Wednesday of the month, from February through December, world-renowned professionals and amateurs in astronomy and related disciplines speak about their projects in San Francisco's Randall Museum. The talks are informal and questions are invited.

Mount Tamalpais Astronomy Program

At sunset, on the Saturday nearest the first quarter moon, professionals from universities, NASA, the Jet Propulsion Laboratory and elsewhere talk about current topics in space science. After the lectures, we make our telescopes available for the public to observe the wonders of the night sky. This program is sponsored by Mount Tamalpais State Park, the Mount Tamalpais Interpretive Association and the SFAA. It is held monthly at Rock Springs Parking Lot on Mount Tamalpais from April through October (www.mttam.net).

City Star Party and Telescope Clinic

Join us for a brief lecture featuring speakers from the local astronomical community, followed by observing through club members' telescopes. It begins just before sunset on one Saturday each month. The City Star party is hosted at one of two sites: the USS San Francisco Memorial near Fort Miley in San Francisco, and at the Randall Museum. This program is a joint effort with the Golden Gate National Recreation Area and the San Francisco Department of Parks and Recreation. Bring your telescope one hour early for lessons at our telescope clinic – a joint project with the San Francisco Sidewalk Astronomers (www.randallmuseum.org, www.nps.gov/goga/parknews/events, www.sfsidewalkastronomers.org).

Our membership consists of people from all walks of life, ages and educational backgrounds.

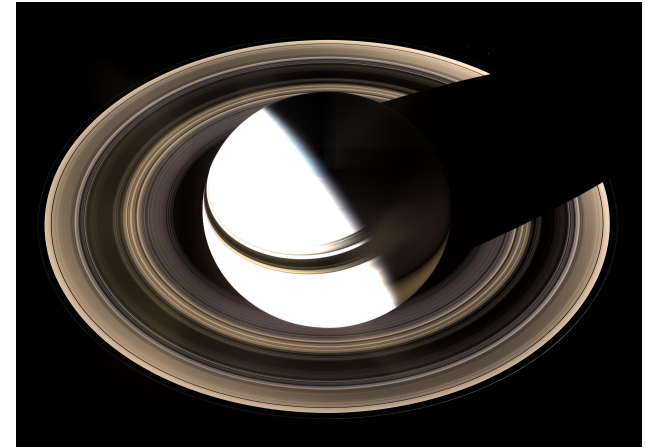
